At Jalgaon, Maharashtra: 1st June 2014





190th ranked Farag stuns Iqbal for 2nd CCI-PSA title



Egyptian qualifier Ali Farag shocked third seed Nasir Iqbal of Pakistan 3-2 to clinch the title in the USD 25,000 2nd CCI-PSA International Squash Championship.

Twenty-two-year-old Farag, ranked 190 in the world, snatched a 11-7, 7-11, 5-11, 11-1, 11-9 win over the Asian senior champion from Peshawar, in an absorbing championship round that lasted 55 minutes, to cap a brilliant run in the event held at the Cricket Club of India's courts.

"It was a very tough match. He came back by playing better and smarter especially in the fifth game and all I had to do was keep going," said Faraq.

"It was a close match and anybody could have won. As much I wanted to win the title, this tournament was very good for me," said the beaten Pakistani finalist.

Prosquash- Please give us a brief introduction about yourself.



Kuala Lumpur: India bagged their second title at the Tri-Nation squash doubles tournament when Dipika Pallikal and Joshna Chinappa emerged winners in the women's doubles final.

Pallikal and Joshna rallied to beat New Zealand's Joelle King and Amanda Landers Murphy 8-11, 11-5, 11-1 in best of 3 games at the National Squash Centre. Hosts Malaysia were the other country to participate in the three-day event, seen as a warm-up to the next month's Commonwealth Games.

It was Pallikal's second title in as many days after she won the mixed doubles with Saurav Ghosal.

The Indians put up a commendable show considering they are busy playing singles for major part of the season.

Chinappa topples top seed Rachael Grinham in Richmond Open



Indian squash star Joshna Chinappa sensationally ended a career-long losing run to Australia's former world champion Rachael Grinham when she upset the top seed in straight games in the final of the Women's Richmond Open to win the inaugural Women's Squash Association World Tour event in the USA.

Chinappa, the 27-year-old world No21 from Chennai, was marking her 16th Tour final in the WSA Tour 10 event at The Country Club of Virginia in Richmond - whilst 37-year-old Grinham, a former world number one from Queensland, was celebrating a mighty 65th final appearance since making her first Tour final back in March 1998.

The title triumph - Chinappa's first win over Grinham in six meetings since September 2010 - marks the ninth WSA Tour title of the Indian champion's career, and her second this year.

Teenager El Sherbini upsets Dipika in Women's Champion Fiberglass Texas Open 2014 held in Houston, USA

Egyptian teenager Nour El Sherbini claimed the biggest Women's Squash Association World Tour title of her career when she upset India's No 4 seed Dipika Pallikal in the final of the Women's Champion Fiberglass Texas Open in Houston, USA.

Pallikal, 22, is the first Indian woman to ever crack the top 10 of the Women's

Squash Association's (WSA) rankings, and currently sits at #12 worldwide. A victory in Houston would have netted Pallikal her first-ever major title.

The Chennai girl had earlier packed off eighth-ranked Madeline Perry in the semi-final but failed against the 13th-ranked Egyptian.

The match brought to a climax a sensational week for El Sherbini of Alexandria, who removed three seeds – including Malaysia's event favourite and world No7 Low Wee Wern - en-route to the final of the WSA Gold 50 event at The Downtown Club at the Met.

El Sherbini was quick sharing her joy with her Facebook fans: "So happy to win my fourth and my biggest title in my career in the Texas Open – it's been an amazing week here started from the first round of the qualification".

Gregory Gaultier of France wins Mens Allam British Open in England

French squash World No.1 Gregory Gaultier claimed the 2014 Allam British Open Squash Championship title, beating England's World Champion and World No.2 Nick Matthew in an emphatic 3-0 performance.

Gaultier, who became the first ever French winner of the prestigious 'Wimbledon of Squash' when he lifted the trophy in 2007, was in imperious form as he reeled off the 11-3, 11-6, 11-2 victory in just 45minutes. It was a sweet victory for the man from Aix En Provence who lost out to Matthew on their last three outings on the PSA World Tour, including a dramatic defeat in the final of the 2013 World Championship in Manchester last November.

World number one Nicol David avenged her title loss last year by beating England's defending champion Laura Massaro in the finals of the Women's Allam British Open Squash Championship to win the historic Women's Squash Association (WSA) World Series Platinum title at the Sports Arena in Hull for the fifth time since 2005.

World No2 Massaro took a tight first game 11-8 before the Malaysian stormed back to take the next three games 11-5, 11-7, 11-8 in 64 minutes to win the 74th WSA World Tour.

The Indian challenge in the tournament ended in the pre-quarterfinals when Joshna Chinappa lost 1-3 to Joelle King of New Zealand.

King seemed to be in control when she jumped to a 2-0 lead, but in the third game, the Kiwi seemed to relax a bit, slowing down the pace a bit and losing control of the T.

That was perfect for Chinappa who rushed to the front and punished King to take the game and stay in the match. However, King reacted well by taking the fourth set, losing just one point, for a 11-6, 11-7, 8-11, 11-1 win in 43 minutes.

Capt C.P Krishnan Nair RIP



A doyen of the hotel industry Capt. C. P. Krishnan Nair, Founder Chairman of The Leela group, passed away peacefully at the age of 92, following a briefillness.

"I never played squash in my young days, it was always football. I played for my school and for the Maratha Light Infantry, which I was serving in Cannanore, playing in the centre half position. When I was transferred to Mumbai, I first saw squash at the United Services Club, one of the finest in the country. Mostly the officers would play there and I took to the sport.

I found squash a vibrant sport and it made your body agile. Then I joined the freedom movement, Free India Army. The MLI regiment soldiers were focused and daring. At Mumbai I had a bungalow to myself and would walk to the squash courts at the U.S. Club. There was tennis as well but I preferred squash. I used to play for an hour every day."

We at ISP will always remember him as he was our backbone and helped us in sponsoring 15 tournaments at Hotel Leela, Mumbai.
