

Pallikal-Chinappa wins historic squash gold



Dipika Pallikal and Joshna Chinappa created history by winning India's first ever squash gold medal at the Commonwealth Games when they won the women's doubles final in straight games to clinch the gold at the Scotstoun Sports Campus.

The Indian combine had a rather easy outing by winning the summit clash 11-6, 11-8 against England's Jenny Duncalf and Laura Massaro, who once again failed in the final after having settled for the silver four years ago in New Delhi.

Another English pair Alison Waters and Emma Beddoes took home the bronze overcoming Australians Rachael Grinham and Kasey Brown 11-3, 11-5 in a playoff.

Though Dipika and Joshna won the first game quite comfortably, they were trailing in the second to the English pair. However, the Indians displayed nerves of steel to overtake their opponents and come out on top to clinch the yellow metal

First Pro Squash Circuit Launched In India

India will stage its first professional squash circuit in October including four Women's Squash Association World Tour events, according to an announcement made in Mumbai.

The JSW Indian Squash Challenger Circuit, sanctioned by the PSA (Professional Squash Association) and WSA and scheduled for October 2014 across Jaipur, Mumbai and Chennai, marks a significant milestone for the sport in Asia.

"We at JSW have always believed that there is a huge talent pool for the sport in the country and have, through the last many years, made a strong commitment to the sport, having nurtured talent at the Jindal Squash Academy - which now has, to its credit, seven international players, 22 national players and 46 state level players," said Mustafa Ghouse, CEO of JSW Sport, the tournament's primary sponsor.

"A challenger series such as this will provide young talent in the sport the appropriate boost and instil in them the confidence needed to perform on an international stage," he continued.

Tommy Berden, Acting CEO of the WSA, added: "We are delighted to welcome the JSW Indian Squash Circuit to our Women's World Tour calendar. With the recent success of Indians Joshana Chinappa and Dipika Pallikal, two of the top players on the Women's Tour, this initiative will go a long way in developing our sport in India and Asia."

Current Indian squash players are excited by this newest competitive opportunity in their country. Dipika Pallikal, India's No1 women's squash player and winner of the country's first squash gold medal in the Commonwealth Games Women's Doubles last month, with Joshana Chinappa, said: "The Challenger Series is a great platform for youngsters to hone their game by playing with some of the top players from across the world, and I strongly believe that that the sport will benefit from it.

"I also hope that we are provided with more such opportunities to host international events of such calibre which can only benefit the popularity and exposure required for the growth of the sport."

"This is a fantastic opportunity for the youngsters in the game to gain some experience and exposure," said Ritwik the PSA/WSA Representative for Asia. It is also is a great exhibition for the promotion of Squash for enthusiasts, fans, as well as India Inc, who can have a visual image of the top athletes from the Professional World Tour in the healthiest sport in the world as voted by the Forbes Magazine.

"Everyone connected with the game of squash in the country is very excited by the arrival of the Indian Challenger Circuit. JSW's support of Squash is the beginning of huge wave of development of the game and certainly paves the way for future champions who will not need to go abroad to gain valuable ranking points and improve their global rankings."

DUTCH JUNIOR U-13 OPEN 2014

At Amsterdam, Netherland (16th July, 2014)

After Pioneer Cup title in Germany, Silver in Iran now Dutch Open silver for India's promising junior Yash Fadte

India's top Under-13 squash player Yash Fadte went down fighting to top seed Jared Carter of England to finish runner-up in the boys under-13 Dutch Junior Open Squash Championship, held at the Frans Otten Stadion, Amsterdam, Netherlands.

Third seed Fadte, who won the Pioneer Cup title in Germany last week and the silver in the 21st Asian Junior Individual Championship in Iran, gave the European champion and England No 1 a



huge scare before going down 9-11, 11-6, 11-5, 16-14 in a 50-minute thriller.

Fadte snatched the opening set in a tight finish and almost forced the decider after stretching the crucial fourth set well into extra points.

Goan lad Fadte, a student of St Joseph's Institute, Vasco kicked off his campaign with a 11-7, 11-6, 11-7 win over qualifier Maxwell Velasquez of the US in the first round and overcame another American Harry Charlton 11-3, 11-9, 14-12 in an exciting second round.

Fadte went on to beat formidable Toufik Mekhalfi of France for the second time in two weeks in the quarter-finals. The Indian, who beat Mekhalfi in the Pioneer Cup final, scored another 11-4, 12-10, 11-6 win.

In the semi-finals, Fadte shocked second seed and European No 2 Tamas Devald of Hungary 11-3, 11-1, 11-9 before losing to Carter in the final of the concluding Super Series event of the European Junior Circuit, played under the auspices of the European Squash Federation.

Squash a Mile, 2014 runs for V-Care

Prosquash speaks to upcoming squash players Manik Dutta and Pradeep Paswan



Manik Dutta, a player who made a scintillating appearance as an Under-15 player in the National Circuit, is presently studying in USA. However, he participated in the recently held NSCI Junior Open and knocked out the top seed. Prosquash takes a look at his progress and future plans.

Prosquash- How did you start playing squash? How did you progress to your national ranking as a sub junior few years ago? Please provide details of your progress from Daly College, move to Scindia, and then abroad.

Manek- I started when I was 12 years old and studing in Mayo College, Ajmer. There, at the starting of the term, every student

had to choose a sport to play for the rest of the year. Funnily enough, apart from an amazing coach (Mr. Dushyant Singh), the only other thing that attracted me towards squash was the fact that all students could get unlimited grams and lemonade to eat and drink! then my parents pushed me through the first four gruelling years of competitive squash. I now realize that they were extremely supportive mentally, emotionally, and needless to say, financially.

It was the first three years that tested my perseverance. Not once did I break through to the top 16 while I was at Mayo. It was not until the 2009 Junior Nationals that I finally realized my potential. It was at this tournament that I beat the 2nd seed to finish 3rd in the U-15 category. From there on, I got invited the represent the country in Qatar. During my time in Daly College, I lived and breathed Squash. I got selected to represent India in three consecutive Asian Juniors at Sri Lanka, Jordan and Iran.

Though, I've just spent a little less than a year in the States, I have loved playing for Princeton University. The standard of squash and the level of intensity at the university are amazing. I suddenly got exposed to an entirely new way of playing the sport and training.

Prosquash- How were the facilities and coaching input and how do they compare with present coaching?

Manek- The coaching at Mayo, Daly and Scindia was really good compared to the rest of the places in India. The coaches at all three schools were outstanding. To be honest, my training in India has been all heart. To compare this with the super specialized and scientific training of Princeton would not really be fair. Luckily, wherever I have gone, the facilities and people have been top class.

Prosquash- Your performance at the NSCI Junior was mind blowing. Take us through how the main matches progressed.

Manek- The NSCI was one tournament I was really looking forward to play once I was in India. As a result of playing after such a long time, I was un-seeded in the Indian circuit. Although, all of my matches were good and the standard was high, I was really looking forward to my match with the first seed (Rajat Sharma) in the quarter-finals. It turned out to be a marathon of a match. It went on for a little more than 90 minutes. It was a roller coaster ride for both of us. Although, at the end of five games and 90 minutes, I won a nail-biting 14-12, it could have gone either way.

Prosquash- Do you play tournaments where you are now and do you intend playing competition in India and abroad in future?

Manek-I love to play in new regions and different places as the nature of

the game changes when you play at new and different places. Just the thrill of playing new players and approaching their game with different strategies excites me. I definitely will keep trying to play as many tournaments as I can.

Prosquash-What are your future plans for squash and otherwise? Manek- Earlier I thought that squash had gotten into my blood. Now I realize that it has altered my DNA (like spiderman)! Men's team give India first ever gold in 17th Asian Games squash, women's team bag silver

Saurav Ghosal and Harinder Pal Sandhu played against all odds to beat tough Malaysian opponents 2-0 in the best-of-three men's squash title contest to provide India with first ever gold in Asian Games.

Giant killer Sandhu pulled off a shocker when he upset Mohd Azlan Iskandar, who had won the singles gold four years ago at Guangzhou, in four games after playing like a man possessed.

He played some very good shots from the forecourt and used the side walls beautifully to carve out a 3-1 victory to give India a great 1-0 start.

Top seed Ghosal, who had squandered the gold medal after holding a commanding 2-0 lead and a match-ball in the third to Kuwait's Abdullah Almazayen earlier in the week, then fought tooth and nail to make a comeback from 0-1 down and get the better of Malaysian veteran and former world no 7 Ong Beng Hee 3-2 to help India snatch the gold medal. Earlier, the Indian women were beaten 0-2 in the team final by Malaysia who were spearheaded by world no 1 Nicol David in the gold medal contest to settle for the silver.

Delia Arnold gave Malaysia the lead when she defeated a fighting Anaka Alankamony 3-0. Nicol David, then, expectedly got the better of India's no 1 player Dipika Pallikal 3-0 to clinch the gold medal.

India, thus, emerged with a total haul of one gold (men's team event), two silver (women's team event and men's individual event) and one bronze (women's individual event) from the Games, their best show thus far in ASIAN GAMES.
