The seasoned squash duo of Saurav Ghosal and Joshana Chinappa clinched the individual gold in contrasting styles in the 35th National Games in India.

It saw complete domination by Tamil Nadu as all the finalists in both the men's and women's competition belonged to the state. First up was women's singles in which the seasoned Joshana Chinappa did not have much trouble in sailing past Lakshya R. 11-5 11-8 11-4 to nab the gold medal.

The bronze medals went to losing semifinalists --Urwashi Joshi of Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh's Sachika Ingale.

In the men's summit clash, Ghosal rallied to beat Harinder Pal Singh Sandhu after conceding the initial advantage. He won the match 4-11 11-4 11-8 11-6 to expectedly walk away with the top honours, while bronze-medallists were Delhi's Gaurav Nadrajoy and Tamil Nadu's Ravi Dixit.

MATUNGA GYMKHANA JUNIOR SQUASH OPEN 2015

At Mumbai : 18th February **Aishwarya, Shahani supreme**

Giant-killers Aishwarya Khubchandani and Tushar Shahani, both of Maharashtra, emerged supreme in the 2-Star Matunga Gymkhana All India Junior Open Squash Tournament, at the ASB glassback courts.

Seeded 3/4, Khubchandani, who had shocked top seed and India No. 3 Avani Nagar in the semi-finals, went on to stun second seed and India No. 6 Aryaa Ogale 12-14, 11-8, 11-7, 11-6 to snatch the girls under-13 crown.

2014 Hong Kong Junior Open champion Tushar Shahani, who upset second seed Aryaman Adik in the semi-finals, stunned top seed Abhay Singh of Tamil Nadu 12-10, 12-10, 10-12, 6-11, 11-9 in the most absorbing championship round to help himself to the boys under-17 title. India No. 1
Shahani, seeded way down at 9/16, lived dangerously after winning the first two sets over extra points and dropping the third and fourth, until he snatched the decider by a whisker.

India No. 1 Navaneeth Prabhu of Tamil Nadu clinched his first title this year when he overcame compatriot



Shreemann Raghavan 11-6, 11-5, 11-6 for the boys under-13 title, while second seed Parthiv Yagnesh, also of TN, halted the winning streak of another giant-killer and find of the tournament Jaivir Singh Dhillon of Delhi 11-7, 5-11, 6-11, 11-5, 11-7 in another thriller, for the boys under-11 crown.

The other champions were, Maharashtra trio Yuvna Gupta, Aakanksha Rao and Veer Chotrani, TN's Sunayna Kuruvilla and Krish Kapur of West Bengal.

PROSQUASH speaks to upcoming squash players

Jannia Singh and Inderjit Singh

Siblings Jannia Singh and Inderjit Singh are at the forefront of junior squash in Chandigarh. Chandigarh has had a splendid tradition in producing top squash players-Col (Retd) K. I Vohra (India No-7- at a time when Mens open category was highly competitive unlike since last 7-8 years), Capt. Arjan Singh (multiple times National Champion), Maj. Radeep Brar (India No-2), Vikas Nayar and Saurabh Nayar (National Champions Over-35), Harinder Pal Singh Sandhu (reigning National Champion) and many junior squash players. Jania has been ranked India No-2 in girls U-13 and Inderjit is on his way up in Boys U-15 rankings and was 7th at the Junior Nationals. PROSQUASH interviews both these budding champions.

PROSQUASH - PLEASE PROVIDE A BRIEF INTRODUCTION ABOUT YOURSELF

Jannia - I am 12 years old and a student of class 8 studying in Carmel Convent School Chandigarh. I took to squash at the age of 8.

Inderjit - I am a student of class 9 studying in St. John's High School in Chandigarh. I took to squash when I was in class 2nd and was eight years old. I've been a state champion since 2009 till date in my age category.



INTERVIEW

PROSQUASH - TELL US ABOUT HOW YOU TOOK UP SQUASH

Jannia - I used to play tennis- my brothers squash coach saw the potential in me and requested my parents to put me in squash.

Inderjit - we have squash courts in our school and I used to watch my seniors play squash and I developed a liking for squash as it tests one's fitness and mental strength. I took up squash when I was in class 2.

PROSQUASH - TELL US ABOUT HOW YOU TOOK UP SQUASH

Jannia- I train for 6 days in a week and study for 1-2 hours on a day. Till date I have been able to cope up both in squash and studies and getting good grades in my studies.

Inderjit- I have my squash sessions 6 days a week in which I play for one hour. During my exams because of the hectic schedule I play squash to de-stress myself. I balance squash with my studies as I study regularly for 2 to 3 hours during weekdays and 3 to four hours during weekends. My academic record in school has been above 98% and I have been felicitated by my school for excellence in academics.

PROSQUASH - ARE YOUR FAMILY MEMBERS ALSO INTERESTED IN SPORTS, OR HAVE A BACKGROUND IN SPORTS? HOW DO THEY ENCOURAGE YOU TO PLAY SQUASH?

Jannia - Both my Father and Grandfather were good athletes and sportsmen of their time. My father after seeing me play tennis encouraged me into squash on the advice of my then coach Puneet Singh.

Inderjit- That's right! My father and my grandfather were both good in hockey and shooting. Though I have a knack in golf and shooting my father encouraged me into squash.

PROSQUASH- WHAT ARE YOUR LATEST ACHIEVEMENTS AND RANKINGS IN SQUASH, AS WELL AS OTHER SPORTS AND CO CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES?

Jannia- I was the winner of Bengal open in U-13 category. Then I was Runners up in Sunil Verma Memorial Squash Championship held in Mumbai, I was again runners up in Hamdard Open Squash Championship held in Delhi and stood Fifth in the junior nationals held in Chennai. I am the State champion in all categories till age categories upto Girls Under 19! My current ranking is Fourth in the U-13 category.

Inderjit - I have been a State champion for the past few years till date, I stood 7th in Junior Nationals held in Chennai, and I stood 3rd in the Gujarat Open. My present ranking is 11. I also participate in the cultural events held in my school.

PROSQUASH - WHAT ARE YOUR OTHER INTERESTS APART FROM SQUASH?

Jannia- I like reading books, gardening, playing with my dogs - Abruse, Nawab, Champ, Dodo. I also like Cooking and Dancing as my hobbies.

Inderjit - I am a good painter and an avid reader.

PROSQUASH - WHAT IS YOUR AMBITION?

Jannia - My ambition is to become the best known squash player in the world and to be an IFS Officer.

Inderjit - My ambition is to represent my country in squash and to get into civil services.

Focus on squash ace Gaultier

1st April 2015

Every nation has a sport which looms large in the eyes of fans in terms of popularity, grabs so much television time and attention of sponsors.

Soccer and tennis are so dominant in France, that for world men's No. 2, Gregory Gaultier, recognition on the streets or in public places like airports happens only in Aix-en-Provence, his own city.



The French ace attained a career best world No. 1 ranking in 2009 and 2014,

becoming the second pro from his country (Thierry Lincou in 2004) to reach the top. "When I return to France after winning titles, people are aware of my achievements in my own city. Nothing compared to say, a tennis player can get. Our nation follows soccer and tennis, squash comes down the order," he said.

France is a powerhouse in world squash, a two-time World Team Squash finalist, going down to Australia in 2003 Vienna (Austria) and Egypt in 2009 Odense (Denmark). Gaultier featured in four World Open Championship finals (2006 Cairo, 2007 Hamilton, 2011 Rotterdam and 2013 Manchester). Lincou had qualified for the 2003 World Open final in Lahore, Pakistan. For the sporting fans back home, theseachievements count for little.

Gaultier reasons that squash is only one of the sports people follow. "We have a lot of sports and various top athletes, so it becomes tough to be on top. When we get results, squash is in the news and we are trying to bring the sport up in France," said the two-time British Open and US Open champion and second on the Professional Squash Association (PSA) rankings after Egypt's Mohammed El Shorbagy.

The 32-year-old was at the Cricket Club of India squash court, Mumbai, as a celebrity player for the PSA exhibition series. The Frenchman sparred with India No. 1, Saurav Ghosal, No. 21 in the world, besides kids invited by CCI to get inspired watching these two leading pros. "There is a long way to go before squash becomes popular in France. We need big events to show the public what squash is all about."

The Olympics Games is the next hope for the sport, feels Gaultier. "The new president of International Olympic Committee (German Olympic fencer Thomas Bach) is keen on bringing new sports into the Games. Squash will get a huge boost, we would then be sure of getting more exposure and television coverage."

Viewer-friendly

The world No. 2 wants his sport to become more viewer-friendly. "The PSA is doing a good job of presenting squash in a better way than before. The filming from different angles have improved," said the French ace, aware of the realities before squash pros like him are rewarded for achievements in world events via recognition at home.

Gaultier is a celebrity in England, said Ritwik Bhattacharya, former India player.

The latter said: "The same event somewhere in England, Gregory Gaultier versus Saurav Ghosal, will have people paying to watch them on court. Squash has such a following there that I am sure people willpay 20 pounds per head to enjoy an exhibition on a glass-back court."

Ritwik is working with the PSA to organise more exhibitions and clinics across India.
