Just like the league stage, India again lost to the eventual champions in the summit clash, Sachika lost in straight games 7-11. 6-11. 10-12 to Sivasangari Subramaniam in the first match, India's top player Joshna Chinappa gave a tough fight to Delia Arnold , who finally prevailed with 9-11, 13-11, 11-8, 11-9 victory
