Of all the juniors Sauray looks the most improved and will be a threat at the Chennai Junior Nationals. In a battle between Chandrakant Pawar wards, Deepali Anvekar beat Priyanka Yaday in the under-19 final. But that Priyanka could take a game shows she is improving steadily. And beating Supriya Balsekar means she should make the Indian national side in the near future. A pity Joshna didn't enter this event because her dad feels the draw would be fudged so that she would meet Deepali in the semis.

Though they won the titles, one wonders how much the winners enjoyed it. You can be sure the losers didn't. Thus Vikram Malhotra, who has been on a roll in under-11 events for the last year

both at home and abroad (Hong Kong), was beaten in the under-11 final by Jay Bhagat. Malhotra had won his eighth title a week earlier at the Little Masters. In the under-13, Gautam Kalani, put it across Jindal lad Sandeep Jangra, who had won at Willingdon.

The opponents in the other events were more or less well matched. Jindal lad Vikas Jangra avenged his Little Masters defeat at the hands of Calcutta's Sauray Ghoshal in the under-15 final, Owing to his tenth standard studies Vikas had not prepared so well for the earlier event. And he learnt from his mistakes and made amends. The under-17 final saw Indore's Yashwardhan Singh turn the tables

on Vishal Kapoor, the top seed. Vishal made the mistake of keeping

the ball in forecourt. He should have known that northern players are strong there. A tiring Kapoor lost this match which had plenty of obstructions, straight. There is no doubt that Yashwardhan, under coaching from Indian international Gajendra Singh, has improved his fitness and lasting power. He gave a good fight to Uberoi in the under-19 semis. There was an upset in the under-17 final where Joshna Chinappa lost to Vaidehi Reddy for the first time. It was an evening when the Chennai lass just couldn't focus. Maybe she was a little complacent in the wake of her win over her opponent the previous day in the under-15 **RESULT ON PAGE - 4**

Joshna however claimed the under-15 girls title outplaying Supriya Balsekar. With Deepali Anvekar almost out of the junior ranks, the final defeat could be just the sting Joshna needs to claim her first under-19 title on home courts. Her opponent could be either her statemate Vaidehi Reddy or Priyanka Yadav. Priyanka has shown remarkable improvement in the new year. Some boasts from back are played with such ease that they evoke sighs of delight from the crowd. Priyanka took a game off Deepali at the Little Masters. With a little luck she could have won the opening game in the Bombay Gymkhana final. But she didn't and Deepali wrapped up the next two with ease to end her under-19 career on a winning note. With Deepali out of the fray Priyanka could be in the title hint at the Junior Nationals All depends on the draw, which in the past has stood between her and the top slots.

Bikram Uberoi is nigh unbeatable among the under-19 lads now that Mihir Kapoor is no longer around. He toys with his opponents. He beat Vishalraj Kapoor in the final. His opponent was dead beat after playing the under-17 final earlier. In this form, the Nationals should be a piece of cake for the lad. Training under Rehmat Khan looks like getting him fitter then ever before. He sure knows how to hustle his opponent for points both legal and otherwise. He keeps adding to his repertoire of shots.
