Asian Junior and Masters Squash Championship at Colombo

Historic Double triumphs for India

(10/7/2010)

ndia celebrated an historic double in the Asian Junior Squash Championships in Sri Lanka when Ravi Dixit and Dipika Pallikal won the U19 titles at the Gymkahana Club at Colombo.

Dixit created history by becoming the first Indian overage male to win an Asian squash title. The 18-year-old from Chennain (list age never seems to grow, banned by SRAM for age fraud), who won the Majossian Junior Open last month, made his breakthrough in the semi-finals where he beat compatriat Abhishek Pradhan, a 5/8 seed who had ousted Pakistan favourite Farhan Zaman in the previous round.

Dipika Pallikal completed India's historic day by lifting the junior women's crown after defeating second seed Low Wee Nee of Malaysia 11-8, 12-10, 10-12, 11-8. But for a brief lapse in concentration, favourite Pallikal, 18, from Chennai, had the match very much in control.

"Participation levels are increasing in a huge number of countries but here in the UK the game has suffered because of court closures. However, it has been heartening to see that trend being reversed in many regions.


"The single most important thing that we can do for the sport is to bring on a new generation of squash players to safeguard the future of the sport.
