Saurav, Joshna retain National titles

Top seeds Saurav Ghosal and Joshna Chinappa fashioned impressive wins to retain the men's and women's titles, respectively, in the 58th Senior National Championship & 67th CCI-Western India Open Squash Tournament at the Cricket Club of India, Mumbai.

World No. 22 Ghosal warmed up for next week's PSA Masters in Delhi with a 10-12, 12-10, 11-4, 11-2 win over third seed Harinderpal Singh Sandhu in a championship round that lasted 55 minutes.

Sandhu snatched the opening game in a tight finish to set the stage for an intense battle against the Asian Games bronze medalist. But Ghosal took the second game in another close finish over extra points and went on to win the third for a 2-1 cushion.

Sandhu began the crucial fourth with hopes of a fightback. But a slew of unforced errors midway through the game ended his challenge as Ghosal won nine points in a row from 2-2 to earn his fifth National crown in a row and his sixth overall.

Ghosal received Rs. 1,25,000 for his effort, while Sandhu received Rs. 63,000. India No. 1 and world No. 36 Joshna Chinappa of Tamil Nadu overcame second seed Saumya Karki of Maharashtra 11-6, 11-4, 11-7 for her eighth National title in a row and 10th overall.

Chinappa received Rs. 40,000, while Karki received Rs. 20,000.

Women's Nepal Open 2010 Pallikal Powers To Historic Tour Title

(17/11/2010)

India's Dipika Pallikal made her mark in squash history by winning the Women's Nepal Open, the first Tour event to be staged in Nepal.

The \$10,900 WISPA World Tour championship was held at the Nepal Squash Academy in the country's capital Kathmandu - and attracted international players from Pakistan, Switzerland, South Africa, New Zealand, and top seed Pallikal from India.

Nepal's first international squash tournament was inaugurated by Prachanda Man Shrestha, CEO of Nepal Tourism Board, who said that the event had played a significant role in promoting the sport as well as tourism in the country.

Amar Keshar Simha, President of the Nepal Squash Rackets Association, also delivered his welcome note and shared good wishes with all the players.

Nepalese interest was extinguished in the quarter-finals, with the two top seeds Pallikal and Kylie Lindsay, the second seed from New Zealand, prevailing in the semis to contest the expected final.

And Lindsay, the world No.47 from Matamoras celebrating her fourth Tour final appearance this year, took the opening game against her higher-ranked opponent.

But teenager Pallikal, the 19-year-old world No.36 from Chennai, baffled back to beat the Kiwi 10-12, 11-2, 11-1, 11-5 to claim the second Tour title of her career.

Punj Lloyd Squash Masters 2010

at Sirifort, New Delhi (20/12/2010)

England 's Matthew & Duncan are the winners, Dipika loses in quarters

England's Nick Matthew finished the year on the best possible high when he beat fellow countryman James Willstrop in the final of the \$192,500 Punj Lloyd PSA Masters to win the tenth and final 2010 PSA Super Series championship at the Siri Fort CWG Block in New Delhi.

"I'm obviously delighted to finish 2010 on a high note, winning the Punj Lloyd PSA Masters," said the jubilant 30-year-old from Sheffield. "It's been the year of my life and I look forward to a good rest before planning the 2011 campaign."

"I'd like to thank James for such a tough match and congratulate him on a strong end to the season and to thank Punj Lloyd for their sponsorship of the event and support of Indian squash."

England's Jenny Duncalf justified her top seeding in the women's WISPA Masters by beating second-seeded Australian Kasey Brown in the final.

World No.2 Duncalf was in sparkling form in the final against an opponent who beat her in October's World Open in Egypt, romping through to beat Brown 11-5, 11-5, 11-4.


"I'm extremely happy to have finished 2010 on such a high note by winning the Punj Lloyd WISPA Masters," Duncalf told Indian media after netting the ninth Tour title of her career.

Earlier Dipika Pallikal went down fighting to the second-seeded Kasey Brown of Australia 5-11, 5-11, 11-7, 11-7, 5-11 in the quarterfinals.

In a battle of wits that lasted just over an hour, the 19-year-old Dipika showed that she had the potential to match the best in the world; this despite a bad start when she lacked the intensity that she showed in the third and fourth games.

"It was an outstanding performance by Dipika against the world No. 7. The difference was the experience of the opponent," said coach Malcolm Willstrop. Dipika said that she took time to get used to the glass court after having played on the outer courts, but hastened to add that she was happy to have lasted five games at the end of an arduous season.

The 25-year-old Kasey praised the mental toughness of Dipika for coming back so strongly after losing the first two games.



Maharashtra State Open Squash Championship

At Bombay Gymkhana (16/11/2010)

Choong Hing, Joshna triumph

Men's third seed Choong Kam Hing of Malaysia and women's top seed Joshna Chinappa of Chennai fashioned convincing wins to emerge supreme in the 35th Bombay Gymkhana-HSBC Maharashtra State Open Squash Championship, co-sponsored by Edelweiss.

Hing overcame Mahesh Mangaonkar 11-8, 11-7, 11-7 in a men's final that lasted 35 minutes, while national champion Chinappa took the same time to beat third seed Saumya Karki 11-8, 12-10, 11-9 in an exciting women's championship round.

Karki, who was in line for a triple crown, was undaunted by the reputation of her much accomplished opponent in a performance that reflected she is due to take over the reins after the country's current top two exponents Chinappa and Dipika Pallikal.

Later, Karki made amends by winning a double after bagging the girls' under-19 and under-17 titles. In the men's final, a supremely confident Hing was in complete control as Mangaonkar battled hard to stay in the match. After snatching the opening two games Hing relaxed his grip for a while and trailed 4-7 in the third. But he quickly recovered to win seven points in a row to take away the game and match.

Earlier, in the semi-finals, Hing beat second seed Gaurav Nandrajog of Delhi 11-7, 11-6, 13-15, 11-5, while Mangaonkar, who won the boys under-19 title, upset top seed Sandeep Jhangra 7-11, 11-6, 11-7, 12-10.

Also earning a double was Aishwarya Bhattacharya who clinched the girls' under-13 and under-15 titles.

Asian Games Squash Championship 2010

(Team & Individual Events) At Guangzhou, China (24/11/2010)

Malaysia, Pakistan wins Gold, while India men and women team settle for bronze

The Indian men and women had to be satisfied with bronze medals after losing to Pakistan and Malaysia respectively in the semifinals of the squash event. Though both teams lost in straight games (0-2), the men fought a lot harder before bowing to Pakistan. Saurav Ghosal went down 13-15, 11-5, 5-11, 6-11 in 52 minutes to Aamir Khan after Siddharth Suchde played his heart out in an 83-minute battle before losing 14-16, 12-10, 9-11, 5-11 to Farhan Mehboob.

In the women's event Wee Wern Low required just 22 minutes to beat Anaka 11-2, 11-4, 11-6 in the first rubber while World No. 1 Nicol David was ruthless in her 11-4, 11-2, 11-3 demolition of Joshna.

"I have played better matches against Nicol before but I couldn't play my best today." Nicol is quick and you need to be 100 per cent ready when you play someone of her class. My idea was to get maximum points off her," said Joshna.

In the individual event Saurav Ghoshal lost his semi-final clash against Mohammad Azlan Iskandar of Malaysia to pick up a bronze medal in the men's singles.

World No. 25 Saurav fought hard against a player ranked ten places higher than him but eventually lost 5-11, 11-6, 5-11, 10-12. Saurav also won a bronze at the Doha Games four years ago.

India could not win a medal in the women's singles as Dipika Pallikal and Joshana Chinappa crashed out in the quarter-finals. Three bronze medals was a considerable improvement for the Indian squash squad which had gone home with a solitary bronze won by Saurav Ghosal in the last edition in Doha.

The Indian pair gave a glimpse of their fighting abilities before going down against the third seed Malaysian pair 5-11 11-7 7-11 in almost an hour contest at the Siri Fort Sports Complex.

The capacity crowd present at the all-glass court arena cheered relentlessly for the Indian pair but that did not prove sufficient to raise the confidence of Ghosal and Chinappa. The pair had claimed a place in the last eight of the Mixed event after a final qualifying round win over Scottish pair Frania Gillen-Buchert and Alan Clyne and a bye in the pre-quarters.

"Both of us played well but that was not enough to secure a win. Team events are altogether a different ball game. They are good and I had to pick my game up at several junctures. As part of the strategy, the Indians were attacking me and we were attacking Joshna".
