

The opening game was a classic. The battle lasted almost an hour, with rarely more than a point separating the pair until the Frenchman emerged the winner 21-19 after one of the highest-scoring games in the history of the 'PAR to 11' scoring system.

But Willstro fought back in the second game to draw level and was in control in the third as it became clear that all was not well with his opponent.

After treatment in the break, world No3 Gaultier returned to the court but was clearly suffering from a cramp. After a few points, the Frenchman conceded the match to give Willstrop the title, and much more!

Double delight for Harinder Pal, Saumya, Urvashi, Vrishab, Aditi and Madhav shines in the final

op seed and India No. 3 Harinder Pal Singh Sandhu helped himself to a double crown in the 1st NSCI Open Squash Championship 2011 at the National Sports Club of India, Worli.

Sandhu, the CCI-Western India runner-up, beat Sandeep Jangra of the Services 12-10, 11-9, 11-8 in an exciting championship round that losted an hour. Jangra came up with a surprise challenge to make every set a close contest as Sandhu held on to take it away.

Later, Sandhu added the doubles crown along with Ravi Dixit as the pair beat cousins Sandeep and Vikas Jangra in straight sets.

Saumya Karki, who won a double at the CCI-Western India last week, continued to dominate the circuit by winning the women's title with an exciting 9-11, 11-5, 11-3, 11-9 victory over arch-rivel Urashi Joshi of Jindia Squash Academy, after surprisingly dropping the opening set and enduring a tight fourth set. But the toast of the day was CCI lad Ness

Billimoria who lit up the finals after going down fighting to top seed Vrishab Kotian of Tamil Nadu in a four-set thriller in the under-19 final.

Trailing 1-2, Billimoria gave the favourite a scare in the crucial fourth set that went down to the wire with Kotian snatching a nail-biter at 17-15.

While Akanksha Salunkhe of Goa completed a rewording campaign by winning the girls under-13 crown, it was a rich haul for Tamil Nadu's talented posse of players as Adithyo Raghavan, Sandeep Ramachandran, Mayuri N. and Professional Aiyappan Parthiban emerged victorious in their respective categories.

Suchde clinches Men's title and triple for Saumya Karki

en's top seed Siddharth Suchde earned his maiden State Open crown, while Saumys Karki helped herself to a triple, lin the 3dth Bombay Gymkhana-HSBC Maharashtra State Open Squash Championship, being played at Bombay Gymkhana, Mumbai. Playing his opponent for the first time, India No. 2 Suchde beat second seed Mahesh Mangaonkar 11-3, 11-9, 11-8 in 45 minutes, in a well contested final between quality players and earned 8s. 1,40,000 for his effort.

After racing ahead in the opening set in the best-of-five championship round, Suchde, ranked No. 64 in the world, fell behind on three occasions with rare blemishes in the second set as world junior No. 3 Mangaonkar led 9-7 with flashes of brilliance. But Suchde's experience came to the fore when he snatched four points in a row to lead 2-0 and never looked back, as he warmed up for his next campaign in the Qatar Open. Favourite Saumya Karki won the women's, girls' under-19 and girls under-17 titles beating Urosshi Joshi of Jindal Squash Academy in all three finals. Saumya earned Rs. 55,000 for the women's crown. Among the juniors, top seed Aryaman Adik beat second seed Dev Vazirani 3-1 in a thriller to clinch the boys under-13 title, while top seed Yohan Pandole of CCI ralliad from 0-2 to overcome Kunj Rawani of Country Club in a five-set hriller.

After beating Aditi Raheja in the Little Masters last week, second seed Abhilasha Bhasin once again upset her arch rival and top seed for the girls' under-11 crown. aurar Ghosal and Dipika Pallikal, the two highest-rankad Indians in the world, are now in the best form of their life and they displayed their allround brilliance in ample measure in the senior National squash championships at the Indian Squash Academy, Chennai.

Saurav didn't show any mercy to Harinder Pal Sandhu winning in 55

minutes 8-11, 11-6, 11-3, 11-1 to bag the men's title for the sixth successive time and seventh overall while Dipika defeated Anaka Alankamony 11-7, 8-11, 11-4, 11-7 for her maiden women's title.

The best of Anaka came in the second game where she proved equal to Dipika in the women's summit clash. Her placements caught the World No.17 napping.

But Dipika took a huge lead in the third game. Anaka wasn't finished yet as she kept pace with Dipika in the fourth. From 8-7, Dipika, however, took charge.

Dipika credited her rise in the World rankings to five-time World Open women's champion Sarah Fitz-Gerald. "She has been a huge influence on me. She has made a lot of changes in my mental outlook," she said.

Navaneeth, Veer are Little Masters

Six titles for Maharashtra, one for Goa and two for TN

op seeds Navaneeth Prabhu of Tamil Nadu won the under-9 crown, while Veer Chotrani of Maharashtra won the boys under-11 title, in the Little Masters Junior Squash Tournament, organized and hosted by the Willingdon Sports Club, Mahalaxmi,

Upcoming Prabhu fashioned a thrilling 11-7, 7-11, 12-10, 8-11, 11-9 win over second seed Neel Joshi of Maharashtra, while Chotrani ended the winning streak of Goa lad Yash Fadte with another pulsating 8-11, 11-8, 11-5, 6-11, 11-7 victory.

Fadte rallied from a 1-2 deficit, winning the crucial fourth game by snatching seven points in a row to force the decider and rattle Chotrani. Fadte looked set to take the fifth and final set and match when he led 6-0 that put Chotrani under immense pressure. But just when it seemed over for Chotrani, the Khar Gymkhana lad fought back, winning eight points in a row to lead 8-6.

It was anybody's contest thereafter until Chotrani led 10-9 and sealed the match with a forehand winner. Vikas Mehra made it a double delight for Tamil Nadu following a 11-8, 5-11, 5-11, 11-6, 11-7 upset win over top seed Arvaman Adik of Maharashtra, after trailing 1-2.

Abhimanyu Shah of Maharashtra bagged the under-17 title with a 3-2 win over Divij Singh of Delhi, while top seed Aishwarya Bhattacharya beat No. 3 Aishwarya Nambiar 11-3, 3-11, 11-6, 11-7 for the airls' under-15 title. Maharashtra 's Abhilasha Bhasin earned her first major title with the under-11 crown. World junior No. 3 and boys' under-19 top seed Mahesh Mangaonkar and girls' under-19 top seed Saumya Karki lived up to their reputations by bagging titles in their respective categories.

PROSQUASH speaks to Aditi Raheja, Abhilasha Bhasin and Utkarsh Kumar upcoming squash players

Aditi Raheja



PROSQUASH: Tell us about how you took up Squash?

Aditi: Squash to me came naturally as I watched my sister Gayatri enjoy playing it. The first time I held the racquet, it was taller than me! Yet I insisted I wanted to compete.

Abhilasha: Squash always fascinated me. I wanted to play a racquet game. I tried lawn tennis but wasn't too excited about it. My first session with Squash is what did it- I knew I would love the game.

Ulkarsh: I had a lot of inclination towards sports. Before squash, I used to play a lot of other sports like badminton, swimming, hould, hackey, tennis etc. One day the Mayo College squash coach, who was keeping a close wortch at me on sports field came up to me and advised me to take up squash. Hence I took up squash. After this, I got so interested in Squash that I stopped playing other sports and concentrated major on Squash.

PROSQUASH: How do you train? How do you balance training with studies?

Adit: I train very hard. My mentor has been Amit sir whose taught me technical, tactical aspects of squash but now I train in otters club. I love it because I've made so many friends and we really have super fun while training.

Its a tough balance to keep squash and my studies. I've been getting academic awards so far, so its even tougher. But I pay lot of attention in school and my school, Dhirubhai Ambani International school is the Abhilasha Bhasin

best in the world! They permit me to come late in the mornings, reschedule my reviews and encourage me all the time. My teachers in school also give me one on one lessons when I miss out.

Abhilasha: Every morning I go to Bombay Gym at 6.30 for a drill. I sometimes follow it up with an evening session too. I do fitness twice a week.

My father has given me permission to play squash provided I do not neglect my studies. I work very hard too and do my daily studies. It helped because I stand first in class too.

Utkarsh: I learnt the basics of the sport in Mayo College. I have two sessions in a day, morning and evening. Morning session is for fitness while the evening session is basically racquet practice. This makes it 3-4 hrs a day.

I set my curriculum in a way that supports my studies also. For half the year, I keep accedemics on priority and Squash for the other half his however does not mean that I stop doing one of them, its simply that bring down the intensity of one of these two for a particular the period. And this has really been successful as I secured pretty well in my class I 2 example.

PROSQUASH: Are your family members also interested in sports, or have a background in sports? How do they encourage you to play squash?"

Aditi: My inspiration is my dad. He used to play squash while my

mother was a National level badminton player. So you can say, sportsmanship runs in my genes! Both my parents never stress on the outcome of the match but stress on the effort. Therefore, if I've not put in my best in practice, my parents do address that.

Last week I played the Bombay Gym U-11 finals and lost 9-11 in the 5th set. I came out smiling because I knew I gave it my 110%. My parents and my school praised me a lot!

Abhilasha: No, none of my family members ever play a sport or are Sportsment However my love for squash is rubbing off on my Father and Bhaiya who have now taken up to learning squash. They are all supportive of my dreams. My mother is always there outside the court encouraging and motivating me and my entire family comes to cheer me when I play my matches.

Utkarsh: My family is not into sports
too much, nor do I have a sports
background. But this does not imply that my

PROSQUASH: What is your ambition?

PROSQUASH: Latest achievements in squash, as well as other sports and co curricular activities?

Adit: I've participated in two nationals so far. Last year I ranked 7th and that was the real start of my training. This year; I played the Malaysian Jr Mila tournament and the Indian Open in Chennai. I gave both these my best and ranked 4th at the Indian Open in the U-11 category.
