NSCI Men's & Women's Open / Doubles Championship

Double delight for Dixit and Mishra

30th Nov 2013

India No.3 Ravi Dixit and Deepak Mishra endured a stiff challenge from top seed Saurav Ghosal and fifth seed Madhav Dhingra to snatch a nail-biting 8-15, 15-9, 15-10 win in the doubles contest of the third edition of NSCI Squash Open Championship.

The battle that lasted almost an hour saw Dixit and Mishra toil away from a 0-1 deficit to bag the crown as the crowd was enthralled.

In the singles, seasoned champions Saurav Ghosal and Joshna Chinappa won the men's and women's singles respectively after chalking up comfortable victories. Chinappa had an easy outing against fourth seed Urshavi Joshi and won 11-3, 12-10, 11-9. Fourth seed Nikita Joshi carved out a 10-12, 11-6, 7-11, 11-8, 11-1 victory in 65 minutes to bag third place.

In the men's title clash, Ghosal lived up to his billing and posted a 11-4, 11-5, 11-3 win over Dixit to take home the winner's purse of Rs.1,50,000.

A day after this newspaper reported the struggles of the 48-year-old mother from Allahabad (UP) stranded on the LTT railway platform with her two children who were here to participate in a squash tournament a deluge of donation pledges, and help with accommodations, training and stay poured in. For the trio the world had changed overnight.

Tehrunnisa, a police constable by profession related how things had suddenly, magically taken a turn for the better. After we were

Chief Co-ordinator Riaz Mohammed interviewed last (Wednesday) evening, the organizers came forward ready to help. They moved us to a guest house last night and also took care of our meals. They told us that we should have come forward earlier with our troubles, informs Tehrunnisa.

I cannot read English but my children read the papers and showed it to me.All we wanted was for our voice to be heard and our worries to be recognized. Now it is done and we have got a platform.

Jay Jhaveri, convenor of the squash tournament says: When the trio came to the club on Wednesday we came to know that they do not have a place to stay. So we immediately arranged for their accommodation. We are willing to extend the same help for any needy player in the future too.

At the venue of the tournament, they were heroes of the day as players and coaches buzzed around with offers of help and practice. This morning I received two calls from people wanting to help us out. I was completed dumbfounded and thought it was some joke. But they really meant it, she informs while daughter Tamanna (19) nods in agreement. Everybody knows us now. People are coming forward helping us out with the childrens game, their technique. There is nothing more I could ask for. Only if they can get a proper coaching opportunity, says Tehrunnisa. After hearing about the promises of help and calls of concern for the family, the stalwart mother closes her eyes and says, I thank God for it all.

The best part of their day,however,was when the children got to meet their squash idol Saurav Ghosal who is the top seed in the on-going tournament. He shook hands with us and encouraged us to play better and work harder, said Tamanna. The picture they clicked with Ghosal will be one memorabilia they would cherish forever.

While both Masoodullah and Tamanna lost their respective matches, the mother was not disheartened. They both fought. With the amount of training or coaching they have received back home, it is not bad, she adds. They sometimes dont take chances. If you break a racket by accident it costs us at least 5000 to 7000.

With the level of interest their story has generated, they might after all play without the fear of losing a fortune with every break of a racket. As Tehrunnisa and her children now know, some dreams do actually come true.

70th CCI-Western India Open Squash Tournament 2013

At CCI, Mumbai 16th Nov 2013

Mangaonkar, Megha, Akanksha win CCI titles

Defending champion and top seed Mahesh Mangaonkar of Maharashtra overcame Kush Kumar of Tamil Nadu to retain the Men's Open title, in the 70th CCI-Western India Open Squash Tournament at the Cricket Club of India.

India No. 2 Mangaonkar, ranked 89 in the world, overcame the national junior champion 7-11, 7-11, 11-3, 11-1, 11-6 in a quality championship round that lasted 70 entertaining minutes.

"I wasn't playing well at the start, but we need to learn to win in such situations," explained Mangaonkar, "I have to be ready for all eventualities and be patient. My shots started coming in the third game. I was hitting tight and deep while later Kush tired and slowed down." While Mangaonkar denied under-19 winner Kush Kumar a double, the trio of Megha Bhatia of Haryana, Ashita Bhengra of Tamil Nadu and Akanksha Salunkhe of Goa was the toast of the day after the girls fashioned stunning victories. Sub junior national champion and Asia No. 5 Megha Bhatia, of Delhi Public School, Gurgaon kicked off a day of exciting action when she rallied from 0-2 to snatch a pulsating 7-11, 9-11, 11-4, 16-14, 11-6 win over top seed Navmi Sharma of Maharashtra for her maiden CCI-Western India under-13 title that culminated in a rewarding season.

Bhatia, winner of the Maharashtra State Open and Pune Open, ignored the early setback and initiated a spectacular recovery with steely determination to force the decider, after snatching the crucial fourth set over extra points. "I never give up," said a beaming Megha, who trains in Noida. "I had nothing to lose, so I gave it my all. It worked when I won the fourth set over extra points. I guess that unnerved Navmi."

National semi-finalist and top seed Ashita Bhengra lived up to her reputation but not before facing a strong challenge from second seed Koel Shankar of Maharashtra to win the under-15 crown 11-5, 12-10, 14-12 in a tight finish. Dutch Junior Open winner and national runner-up Akanksha Salunkhe completed the action-packed day when she shocked top seed Aishwarya Bhattacharya of Maharashtra 15-13, 11-6, 13-11 in another thriller for the under-17 title.

Giant-killer Salunkhe, who shocked second seed Jui Kalgutkar of Maharashtra in the semi-finals, rallied brilliantly from early deficits in the first and third sets that stretched over extra points. The Vasco lass covered the court magnificently and was especially lethal on the forehand.

"I have been training hard after my loss in the junior national final. That loss in Indore was disappointing but it only strengthened my resolve to improve and win," explained Salunkhe. "I have been playing well since then. I got the opportunity here and was rewarded. Aishwarya was also very good but I won crucial points in the end." Veer Chotrani of Maharashtra, Yash Bhargav of Delhi and Ranjit Singh of UP were the other significant winners.

But my family deserves most of the credit for inspiring me and standing by me through it all," she says. "A dad who is encouraging, a mother who is my pillar of support, I am truly blessed to have them by my side," she adds.

Managing her life as a student and her professional career in squash is a tightrope walk. "It is the hardest balance ever. But I've been blessed with an understanding school, supportive teachers who have helped me throughout. I do miss classes, but I have always made sure that I make up the schoolwork because I do love my studies. Economics is a subject I really like, but apart from my professional career, I would like to learn psychology . Playing squash helps me focus," Lakshmi says.

She would like to strive to the best of her abilities over the next five years "and give back to the sport that I love. The squash scene has been improving lately, but it still doesn't have the funds or awareness that it deserves. As for my professional career, I have taken part in the US Open, British Open, Swiss Open, and have also been playing pro tournaments in Australia. I want to make my way into the top 50 within a year from now," Lakshmi says, on a positive note.

Dipika Pallikal beats former World No. 1 to win Macau Open: 20th October 2013

India's top squash player Dipika Pallikal upstaged former World No.1 Rachael Grinham of Australia to win the Macau Open, the seventh Women's Squash Association (WSA) title of her career.

It was a commendable performance from the 22-year-old, who reached the final defeating Rachael's younger sister Natalie, a former World No.2 currently ranked eighth in the WSA rankings.

There was not much to choose between the two finalists. Dipika played better in the crucial stages of the 42-minute contest, capping off a memorable week with a 12-10, 5-11, 11-7, 11-9 victory.

Dipika, the first Indian to break into the top-10, had beaten another higher-ranked player, Kasey Brown of Australia, in a New York tournament in September.

"It is time I beat the top-10 players regularly. One of the reasons I have started beating them is Ken Way," she said of the sports psychologist, who has also worked with Dipika's coach and five-time World Open winner Sarah Fitz-Gerald.

"Ken has helped me a lot. Earlier it was frustrating to come close to beating the higher-ranked players. With his help, and Sarah of course, I am playing the mental side of the game better," said Dipika.
